Categories:	Juvenile Open	16 and under (maximum age 16)
	Junior Open	under 21 (maximum of age 20)
	Special Olympics	13 and over
	Super Seniors	55+
Participants per Region:	4 players (any combination of males and/or females) per category plus 1 Coach per team (10 max.) (spare pool, as per CCA, available at Host site.) Special Olympics: 4 players plus 1 coach/manager and chaperones as required.	
Eligibility:	Age as of Dec. 31st prior to the Games. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Host Club and participating curlers must be affiliated with the BC Ladies Curling Association, for females, and the BC Interior Curling Association, for males.• Participants that are not members of any BC curling association must pay a non-member fee by November 1.• (Non-member fees are forwarded to the Curl BC office: \$6 for Juniors and Juveniles and \$12 for Adults)• No curler will have been, or will be, selected for a Provincial or BC Winter Games team competing the same season as these Games.• Chaperones must be 19 years of age and the same gender as the team. The chaperone as well as the coach will fulfil; the roles of chaperone with a mixed team. Chaperones must travel with the team.• Teams are selected by a Regional Playdown organized by the Sport Regional Reps in each region by December 1.	
Coach Certification:	Level 1 Theory required and Level 1 Technical in curling required. Full Level 1 Certification is suggested.	
Sanctioning:	Curl BC	
Entry Fee:	\$50.00 per Participant (Coaches and Managers included). Plus any non-member fee required as described above.	
Tournament Draw:	Regional Playdowns:	for 3 teams & under – double round robin For 4 teams and more: double knockout
	Games Competition:	modified double knockout
Games:	8 ends with extra end to break ties	
Awards:	Gold, Silver and Bronze medals in each Category. When there are four or more competitors or teams, Bronze, Silver and Gold medals will be awarded. When there are three competitors or teams, Silver and Gold medals will be awarded. When there are two competitors or teams only a Gold medal will be awarded.	
Venue Requirements:	Required number of ice sheets will be determined based on the categories of events

Rules:

Canadian Curling Association rules apply. Local rules must be approved by the BCLCA and CICA by November 1 of the year prior to the competition.

a) Substitutions: a spare pool will be made available by the host club to meet the needs of the competition in each category as established by the Head Official

b) Replacements:

- Where a region winning team is unable to continue with at least two (2) of its original (registered) team members, the runner-up team shall replace them. The replacement team must be approved by the parent Curling Association and this team must be listed on the registration entry form as the alternate players.

- Where one or more of the regions are missing representation, it is possible for the NBCWG Society to round out the competition with a team that meets the criteria. The replacement team must be approved by the parent Curling Association.

c) Equipment: supplied by the participants

d) Time outs: as per the rules for junior and juvenile competitions including one fair play time out per game. As this competition is considered 'developmental play', coaches will be permitted to call time-outs.

Officiating: **Regional Playdowns:** Required: a Level I Head Official

Games Competition:

Required: A Level II Head Official and at least one (1) on-ice supervisor. One (1) on-ice Observer is required per sheet of ice.

Suggested: One (1) Home supervisor and one (1) Away Supervisor

Special Olympics Categories:

Officials for Special Olympics categories are requested to act as facilitators to ensure the safety and enjoyment of participants.

Local Volunteer Officials

Volunteer officials will be trained by the Head Official as required. Hogline violations will be noted and a warning given to the participant in violation of the hogline rule. A hogline official will be provided if requested.

No officials will be paid a fee by the Games or the PSO for their services. Transportation, accommodation and a per diem for meals will be provided by the Northern BC Winter Games Host Community.
