### Terrace hosts BC's next Winter Olympians at the 2010 BC Winter Games

The BC Games Society invites editors and sport reporters to attend the Terrace 2010 BC Winter Games, March 4-7.

The community of Terrace will host British Columbia's best and brightest developing athletes. With an average athlete age of just over 13 years, the BC Games are an important step for athletes towards provincial and national team programs. We expect to see many of these young stars compete on the international stage in the years to come. Forty-three percent of the athletes from BC on Canada's 2010 Winter Olympic Team have competed at a BC Games. Those athletes are:

The experience of the BC Winter Games was an important stepping stone on my way to the Olympic Winter Games in Torino and Vancouver."

Joining the 1100 athletes at the Terrace 2010 BC Winter Games will be 279 coaches, and 174 technical officials. Sixteen sports will be hosted at venues throughout Terrace and Kitimat.
