Fort St. John 2007 Northern BC Winter Games

Swimming

Categories: **Swim BC Youth** –14 and Under and 15 and Over
BCSSA Swimmers –14 and Under and 15 and Over
Special Olympics – 11 years and older
Swimmers with a Disability - 11 yrs and older

BCSSA and Swim BC swimmers compete together, separate events for males and females. Special Olympic swimmers and Swimmers with a Disability compete together, combined male and female events, except where numbers warrant separate events.

Participants: **Swim BC** - 12 per region, any combination, plus 1 Coach (13 max.)
BCSSA - 12 per region, any combination, plus 1 Coach (13 max)
Special Olympics swimmers and Swimmers with a Disability- Open number per region, plus Coaches and chaperones

A maximum of 192 (96 Swim BC and 96 BC Summer Swim athletes) plus a maximum of 16 coaches for Swim BC and BCSSA teams will be permitted for the sport. An open number of Special Olympics and Swimmers with a Disability athletes and their coaches/managers will be permitted for the sport.

Backfilling: Each region may only register the number of athletes indicated above. Other athletes must be registered as Substitutes. Once registration is complete, the Northern BC Winter Games Society will backfill the unused spots from the list of substitute teams, based on policy and the ability to host. Swim BC will and BCSSA will have input into filling participants from their regional participants lists.

Rules: Swim BC and Swimming Natation Canada

Eligibility: Age as of Dec. 31st prior to the Games.
Able Bodied Swimmers and Swimmers with a Disability must be registered Swim BC or F.I.N.A. (Summer Swimmers must be registered with BCSSA). Special Olympics must be registered with BC Special Olympics.
Any swimmer having attained a Swim BC AAA standard, OR an SNC Western Canadian Championship standard OR and SNC Senior National standard at the time of the BC Northern Winter Games will be ineligible to compete.
All Swimmers must conform to sanction requirements established by Swim BC.

Coach Certification: Minimum NCCP Level 1 Certification

Officials: A maximum of 20 officials are permitted for the sport. Officials must be registered by the registration deadline. Referee and Starter will be Swim BC officials registered with the BCSOA (BC Swim Officials Association).

Sanctioning: Swim BC. Sanctioning must be applied for by the Host Community by October 15 prior to the Games.

Entry Fee: \$65.00 per Participant (Coaches and Managers included).

Awards: Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded in all categories or events, as specified in Sport Technical Package, where a competition exists. If there is only one person or team in an event or category no medals will be awarded; this athlete/team however, will be presented with a participation certificate. This athlete/team may also compete in an alternate category/event, if the sport's rules permit. Only Northern BC Winter Games Society medals are permitted to be awarded.

A completed Team List (for team events) must also be submitted to the Regional Representative by the deadline.
