PSO/DSO	Amount	Project(s)
Baseball BC	\$ 10,000	The project includes hosting coach and official development opportunities in Prince George with a focus on coaches and officials from Zone 7 (North West) and Zone 8 (Cariboo-North East). The intended outcome of the project is to develop competitive baseball programs in northern BC that will strengthen the sport's ability to field teams and officials from those zones at the BC Summer Games.
Basketball BC	\$ 4,500	The project includes offering coach development opportunities to targeted 2022 BC Summer Games coaches from Zone 1 (Kootenays), Zone 7 (North West), and Zone 8 (Cariboo-North East). These coaches would have their expenses related to attending a Learn to Train clinic covered to ensure they have the required certification level for the BC Games. The intended outcome of the project is to have qualified coaches that will strengthen the sport's ability to field teams from those zones at the BC Summer Games.
BC Artistic Swimming	\$ 10,750	The project includes sustainable club development opportunities in partnership with local clubs in Zone 1 (Kootenays), Zone 3 (Fraser Valley), and Zone 8 (Cariboo-North East). The identified local clubs are the Nelson Reflections, the Maple Ridge Artistic Swimming Club, and the Prince George Waterlilies. The intended outcome of the project is to support the sustainability of these local clubs which will strengthen the sport's ability to field participants from these zones at the BC Summer Games.
BC Lacrosse Association	\$ 7,000	The project includes the acquisition of equipment for use in competition and training. Equipment may include canopies, portable goals, scoreboards, video equipment, or other equipment that the BC Lacrosse Association may use at the BC Summer Games and other competition and training events across British Columbia. The intended outcome of the project is to offer a higher standard of equipment available for use at the BC Summer Games.
BC Sailing	\$ 3,165	The project includes the acquisition of equipment for use in competition and training. Equipment may include inflatable race marks, signal flags, starting timers, GPS

		units, ground tackle, or other equipment that BC Sailing may use at the BC Summer Games and other competition and training events across British Columbia. The intended outcome of the project is to offer proper race equipment that will allow for a higher standard of competition at the BC Summer Games.
BC Soccer	\$ 4,500	The project includes offering coach development opportunities. Coaches will have the opportunity to complete Respect in Sport's Activity Leader Training. The intended outcome of the project is to have qualified coaches that can lead club activities which will in turn strengthen the sport's ability to field teams from underserved zones at the BC Summer Games.
British Columbia Wrestling Association	\$ 7,000	The projects includes hosting athlete development camps and coach and official development opportunities throughout British Columbia. The intended outcome of the projects is to provide better training opportunities for athletes in advance of their participation in the BC Summer Games, as well as ensure more coaches and officials are certified at the appropriate levels for the BC Summer Games.
Canoe Kayak BC	\$ 10,750	The project includes hosting coach mentorship programs and athlete development camps in each BC Games zone. Existing certified head coaches will mentor new coaches in their region. These coaches will assist in running the athlete development camps which will be open to all age eligible athletes. The intended outcome of the project is to have more certified coaches in each zone who will in turn be able to support athlete development in each zone, both pieces ultimately resulting in the sport having more meaningful competition at the BC Summer Games.
Horse Council BC	\$ 10,750	The project includes hosting coach mentorship programs and athlete development clinics in each BC Games zone. Existing head coaches will mentor assistant coaches in their region. These coaches will assist in running the athlete development clinics which will be open to all age eligible athletes. The intended outcome of the project is to have more certified coaches in each zone who will in turn be able to support athlete development in each zone, both pieces ultimately resulting in the sport having more meaningful competition at the BC Summer Games.
Rowing BC	\$ 10,750	The project includes the acquisition of equipment for use at regattas across the province as part of the "Regatta in a Box" initiative. Equipment may include a timing system,

		regatta kit, trailer, or other equipment that Rowing BC may use at the BC Summer Games and other competition and training events across British Columbia. The intended outcome of the project is to offer a higher standard of equipment available for use at the BC Summer Games and regattas across the province, which will provide athletes with more exposure to higher quality competitions.
Softball BC	\$ 7,500	The project includes development opportunities for Indigenous athletes and coaches, as well as officials' development opportunities in Zone 1 (Kootenays), Zone 7 (North West), and Zone 8 (Cariboo-North East) with a focus on Indigenous officials. The intended outcome of the projects is to increase Indigenous participation in the sport at the BC Summer Games and to ensure more certified officials are available across the province to support competition and training opportunities.
Special Olympics BC	\$ 11,250	The project includes sustainable program development opportunities in communities in Zone 1 (Kootenays), Zone 7 (North West), and Zone 8 (Cariboo-North East). Four new programs and two existing programs are expected to be supported through this initiative. Additionally, the initiative includes a mentorship program for coaches and competition opportunities for participants in the targeted zones. The intended outcome of the project is to support program, coach, and athlete development which will strengthen the sport's ability to field participants from these zones at the BC Summer Games and result in more meaningful competition.
Swim BC	\$ 10,000	The projects includes a training and mentorship program for Indigenous coaches, as well as officials' development opportunities in Zone 1 (Kootenays), Zone 7 (North West), and Zone 8 (Cariboo-North East). Indigenous coaches will be provided with coach education courses and a six-month mentorship program, while officials will be provided with the opportunity to advance their certification to Level III. The intended outcome of the projects is to increase Indigenous participation in the sport at the BC Summer Games and to ensure more certified officials are available across the province to support competition and training opportunities.
Triathlon BC	\$ 10,750	The project includes the acquisition of chip timing equipment for use in competition and training. The equipment will be sourced through third party race timing company Zone4. Equipment may include timing chips, chip activators, or other equipment that Triathlon BC

		<p>may use at the BC Summer Games and other competition and training events across British Columbia. The intended outcome of the project is to offer a higher standard of equipment available for use at the BC Summer Games which will allow for more meaningful competition.</p>
Volleyball BC	\$ 7,500	<p>The projects includes creating virtual coach and referee education and development opportunities. These projects will move existing in-person education and development modules into an online format, which will enhance the accessibility of these opportunities to coaches and referees across British Columbia. The intended outcome of the project is to have qualified coaches and referees that will strengthen the sport's ability to provide the best possible experience for athletes at the BC Summer Games.</p>
Water Ski & Wakeboard British Columbia	\$ 3,835	<p>The project includes the acquisition of competition tracking and setup infrastructure for use in competition and training. Equipment may include the B4 SkiPath Full Kit or other equipment that Water Ski and Wakeboard BC may use at the BC Summer Games and other competition and training events across British Columbia. The intended outcome of the project is to offer proper race equipment that will allow for a higher standard of competition at the BC Summer Games and to reduce costs associated with venue setup.</p>
